RITA I'm sorry. I didn't know.

MONTY She was a very private woman. Bit old fashioned in some ways.

And she wanted to marry for love, I guess, and she knew that she didn't love me. So that's was it for her. Some people get hitched just not to be lonely, but she was a very principled, you might say,

idealistic woman. A dreamer.

RITA That's got my name on it.

(An envelope.)

Monty Yeah. That's for you.

RITA I think I know what it is.

MONTY I've read it. It's bloody brilliant.

RITA Is it? Oh Jeez.

(RITA takes the envelope.)

Monty She put her whole life into that speech. (Pause.) I let her down, you

know.

RITA No, Monty, no.

MONTY I've let all you girls down.

RITA How's that?

MONTY Rita, in a million ways.

(End of scene.)

Music No. 17b: SAME OLD STORY - Scene Change

SCENE TEN

A playground or park. Eddie, Stan and Barry are sat on the park bench.

BARRY D'you remember Len Wilson? Red hair, freckles, glass eye.

110 Act Two

STAN No. What he look like?

EDDIE I know him. West Ham.

BARRY His wife becomes Lord Mayor of Hornchurch so Len starts calling

himself Lady Mayoress.

Eddie Why?

STAN To get his expenses.

BARRY He gets himself a handbag to carry all her stuff around, and

because he's got a handbag, he gets himself matching high heels.

Eddie This is about me, you're having a go at me aren't you.

BARRY What happened to Len?

STAN He ended up having a sex change operation he didn't want.

Eddie Alright! Alright! What's your point, Stan?

STAN Behind every powerful woman, there's a man waiting for surgery.

BARRY Sort her out, Eddie. We've all got mouths to feed.

(Enter RITA. She is carrying the speech envelope from the previous

scene. Eddie is there, seemingly alone.)

RITA I'm sorry I'm late.

Eddie I knew you'd be late.

RITA Where are the kids? I'll take them.

Eddie They're coming back to Mum's.

RITA The arrangement was that I'd pick them up from here.

EDDIE Yeah, but being a mother to my kids ain't enough for you, is it?

Saving the world –

RITA – Eddie, I've got to do this. I've got a lot on my plate at the

moment, but that won't last forever. I've got to do this.

Eddie Kids need looking after, feeding, washing, I dunno.

RITA No, I know you, Eddie, it's cos you didn't have a clean shirt.

Ironed the way your mother does.

Eddie Don't blame me, you done this.

RITA You stole my kids away in the middle of the night!

Eddle It wasn't the middle of the night. It was the middle of the night

when you got home and first noticed them missing.

(A bail bounces across the stage, chased by Sharon.)

RITA Hiya m'love.

Eddie We're going back to Gran's.

Sharon I don't want to go. Grandma licks her plate!

EDDIE If you'd been through the war, you'd lick your plate.

(Enter Graham.)

Graham Hiya mum.

RITA Hi. Do you understand why I can't be at your concert?

GRAHAM It's alright.

Eddie Come on, get your stuff, we're going.

RITA You've got to go with your dad, babe.

EDDIE Graham! Come on now!

RITA (To Sharon.) It's just for this week, Sugar. I promise.

EDDIE It's broken.

RITA What's broken?

112 Act Two

Eddie Our marriage.

RITA You walked out.

Eddie I didn't walk out, you did.

(Eddie exits.)

RITA

I'M STILL HERE, I AIN'T GIVEN UP I'M STILL A MOTHER AND A WIFE BUT ALL THIS HAPPENED SUDDENLY IT JUST DROPPED INTO OUR LIFE

I CAN'T LET ANYONE DOWN
SO WHAT AM I SUPPOSED TO DO?
DON'T TURN YOUR BACK ON ME NOW
COS NOW'S THE TIME THAT I NEED YOU

I THOUGHT I HAD THE FUTURE IN THE PALM OF MY HAND

I THOUGHT YOU WERE BESIDE ME AND OUR DREAMS WERE ALL PLANNED

THOUGHT WE WOULD WE STAY TOGETHER NOW THE WORLD'S COLD AND SMALL THOUGHT THAT WE'D GROW OLD AND GRAY TOGETHER; OH BABE, WE NEARLY HAD IT ALL

AND WHAT ABOUT OUR DAUGHTER I WANT TO LOOK AT HER AND SEE THAT HER FUTURE'S FULL OF HOPE SO SHE DON'T END UP LIKE ME

(Eddie and the Kids are gone. Rita leaves. She takes the speech with her. End of scene.)
