Barbara You're Rita O'Grady, aren't you?

BARBARA (To driver.) Go on, Ted, I'll see you in a minute.

BARBARA I'm in a difficult position, Rita, I've got to balance the trade

figures, so I want you back at work, but I'm also a woman.

RITA Is that why you went into politics? To balance the trade figures?

BARBARA (Beat.) Come to Westminster, tomorrow. Let's talk it through.

RITA Can I bring some of the other girls?

BARBARA Yes, why not. One o'clock. Tomorrow.

(BARBARA gives her a card.)

Do you want a lift? That's my Bentley.

RITA No it isn't. It's my Bentley. I paid for it. As a taxpayer.

BARBARA You're right. Love. (Beat.) Can you give me a lift?

RITA Oh, alright then.

(They exit. End of scene.)
